Two economic outlooks, two very different outcomes: a second Trump term or a Joe Biden administration.


Biden won – but more jobs and full employment only happen if Jon Ossoff and Raphael Warnock win on January 5.



REPUBLICANS:

HIGHER UNEMPLOYMENT AND A WEAKER ECONOMY



- Growth outlook: Economy sputters out of COVID-19 crisis, unemployment stays high
- "Economic outlook is weakest under a scenario in which Republicans fully adopt their economic agenda...
 Unemployment remains persistently higher and labor force participation rate never fully recovers from prepandemic levels."[1]







MORE JOBS, FULL EMPLOYMENT. With a **Senate** majority, President-elect Joe Biden can get our economy back on track



- Jobs created in a Biden presidency: 18.6 million^[2]
- Growth outlook: Economy returns to full employment

Sen. David Perdue and Senator Kelly Loeffler vote against COVID-19 relief, infrastructure and union rights

Scenario 2



John Ossoff and Rev. Raphael Warnock are proponents of Joe Biden's vision



- **Perdue** supports Senate Republicans' inadequate HEALS Act, a bill that cuts the \$600 in weekly unemployment benefits, does nothing to keep workers safe and instead only protects corporations from liability^[5]
- Loeffler and Perdue are co-sponsors on the SAFE to Work Act that limits the liability for companies who have not followed COVID-19 precautions^[13]



- Ossoff: "We need President-elect Joe
 Biden and Vice President-elect Kamala
 Harris to be able to govern, to get us out
 of this mess...to invest in infrastructure
 and clean energy. If we don't win these
 Senate races it will be gridlock in
 Washington."[4]
 - Supports a ramping up of spending for relief to Georgia's working families^[8]
- Warnock pledges to listen to the experts to take steps to get the coronavirus under control, including supporting robust testing, contact tracing, and basic preventive safety like the use of face masks^[15]

- **Perdue** voted against the last comprehensive infrastructure package, the FAST Act that funds our nation's transit systems, highways, bridges and rail networks^[6]
- Loeffler voted against a bill that extended the FAST Act, an important surface transportation program that was set to expire. Without this extension all federal grant programs would have been left without funding during the COVID-19 pandemic^[14]
- **Ossoff** has stated that he supports the most ambitious infrastructure program in history^[8]
- Warnock believes reinvesting in a clean economy based on green transportation and energy infrastructure, we can create good, family-sustaining jobs that will prepare us for the 21st century^[23]

Perdue voted for an amendment that would prohibit the use of PLAs on projects with federal funding^[7]

Ossoff and Warnock supports the Protecting the Right to Organize Act^{[11][16]}

Perdue and Loeffler co-sponsored S.525, the National Right-to-Work Act^[9] and Perdue co-sponsored S.2630, the Davis-Bacon Repeal Act^[10]

Ossoff will expose and attack unfair and unethical trade and labor practices^[8]

Perdue co-sponsored a bill that would prevent federal agencies and recipients of federal funding from requiring contractors to sign PLAs^[12]

Warnock pledges to end right-to-work status in Georgia and to "bring pro-worker values to Washington" [15]
