109th Congress U.S. House of Representatives

1. Class Action Fairness (02/17/2005, Roll Call No. 36)

Congressman John Conyers (D-MI) offered a substitute amendment that would allow for several exemptions to the underlying bill's new class action rules. Among these exemptions were wage and civil rights suits, which have never been cited as a problem requiring correction and whose inclusion will make justice for victims in these cases more difficult. The vote on the Conyers amendment was rejected by a vote of 178-247. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #36, February 17, 2005: SUPPORT (Yes=Right, No=Wrong).

2. Energy/PUHCA (04/20/2005, Roll Call No. 123)

Congressman John Dingell (D-MI) offered an amendment to the Energy Bill (H.R. 6) that would authorize the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to refund electricity overcharges and increase the penalties for violations of the Federal Power Act, including raising the criminal penalties for individuals from \$5,000 to \$5 million. It would strike a provision in the bill repealing the Public Utility Holding Company Act (PUHCA), and direct the Securities Exchange Commission to review utility companies compliance with PUHCA. The Dingell Amendment was rejected by a vote of 188-243. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #123, April 20, 2005: SUPPORT (Yes=Right, No=Wrong).

3. Transportation/Amtrak (06/29/2005, Roll Call No. 336)

The Fiscal Year 2006 proposed budget would have eliminated nearly all funding of Amtrak's long-distance passenger rail service and prohibit the use of federal funds for specified Amtrak routes, all of which require federal subsidies. It threatened to shut down Amtrak service to thousands of passengers. An amendment to H.R. 3058 that prevented this de-funding passed by a vote of 269-152. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call vote #336, June 29, 2005: SUPPORT (Yes=Right, No=Wrong).

4. OSHA/Attorney's Fees (07/12/2005, Roll Call No. 372)

The House passed a bill designed to prohibit the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) from vigorously pursuing violators under the guise of a redress system. H.R. 742 passed by a vote of 235-187. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #372, July 12, 2005: OPPOSE (Yes=Wrong, No=Right).

5. Trade/CAFTA (07/28/2005, Roll Call No. 443)

H.R. 3045, a bill to implement the Dominican Republic-Central American Free Trade Agreement (DR-CAFTA), a bad trade deal between the United States and the Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua passed by a vote of 217-215. DR-CAFTA does not include protections for workers' rights to form a union or to have safe working conditions on the job, nor does it include adequate enforcement mechanisms for violations of internationally recognized labor and environmental standards. DR-CAFTA will export jobs and weaken the U.S. economic base. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #443, July 28, 2005: OPPOSE (Yes=Wrong, No=Right).

6. Energy/Policy (07/28/2005, Roll Call No. 445)

The IBEW supported final passage of H.R. 6, the Energy Policy Act of 2005, after provisions were included to protect the interests of consumers and investors by granting FERC several additional safeguard authorities. The bill provides support for maintaining a viable, safe nuclear power industry, for the production of new nuclear facilities and for reauthorization of the Price-Anderson Act. Personnel and training measures are included to address the serious shortage of skilled workers in the energy industry. Consumer protections are incorporated that ban market manipulation and require market transparency. The bill passed the House by a vote of 275-156. The IBEW position of Official Roll Call Vote #445, July 28, 2005: SUPPORT (Yes=Right, No=Wrong).

7. Transportation/Amtrak (06/13/2006, Roll Call No. 263)

The Fiscal Year 2007 proposed budget would have cut Amtrak funding placing the nation's passenger railroad on the brink of bankruptcy and displacing thousands of workers. An amendment to H.R. 5576, which prevented this reduction in funding, passed by a vote of 266-158. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #263, June 13, 2006: SUPPORT (Yes=Right, No=Wrong).

8. Trade/U.S.-Oman (07/20/2006, Roll Call No. 392)

The poorly negotiated U.S. Oman Free Trade Agreement (FTA) contains the same woefully inadequate labor rights provisions as the Central American Free Trade Agreement (CAFTA); does nothing to address human trafficking in Oman; and presents, once again, a threat to prevailing wage and other American labor law. The United States – Oman Free Trade Agreement (H.R. 5684) passed by a vote of 221-205. The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #392, July 20, 2006: OPPOSE. (Yes=Wrong, No=Right).
