



# 2007-2008 IBEW<sup>®</sup> Vote Report



## 110<sup>th</sup> Congress U.S. House

### **1. Minimum Wage / Passage—H.R. 2— (01/10/2007, [Roll Call No. 18](#))**

For more than 10 years, the federal minimum wage remained at \$5.15 an hour. Because of inflation, its purchasing power in 2007 was at its lowest level in 51 years. The Bush administration and Republican congressional leaders blocked many attempts over the years to raise the wage. But a new Democratic majority opened the way to boost the minimum wage. H.R. 2 increases the federal minimum wage by \$2.10 over two years—from \$5.15 an hour to \$7.25 an hour in three steps—to \$5.85 an hour 60 days after enactment, then to \$6.55 a year later and to \$7.25 the next year. The bill also extends federal minimum wage requirements to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and sets it at \$3.55 an hour 60 days after enactment, then raises it in 50-cent increments every six months until it reaches the \$7.25 per-hour level. The bill passed January 10, 2007 by 315-116 (R: 82-116; D: 233-0). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #18, January 10, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong).**

### **2. Medicare Prescription Drug Negotiations/Passage—H.R. 4—(01/12/2007, [Roll Call No. 23](#))**

Millions of seniors rely on the Medicare Part D prescription drug program, but they face soaring drug prices while the pharmaceutical industry pockets billions in profits. In the first six months after the drug program went into effect in 2006, drug company profits increased by more than \$8 billion. A Bush-backed provision in the 2003 bill that established the prescription drug program prohibited Medicare from using its purchasing power and negotiating with drug makers for lower prices. H.R. 4 would require the Department of Health and Human Services to negotiate with drug companies to lower the price of drugs covered under the Medicare Part D program. The bill passed Jan. 12 by 255-170 (R: 24-170; D: 231-0). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #23, January 12, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong).**

### **3. Employee Free Choice Act / Anti-Salting Amendment-H.R. 800— (03/01/2007 – [Roll Call No. 114](#))**

The Employee Free Choice Act would restore workers' freedom to form unions and bargain for better wages, benefits and working conditions without employer harassment. When workers try to form unions, employers routinely harass, intimidate and even fire workers. During consideration of the bill, the House rejected an amendment by Rep. Steve King, (R-Iowa) that would have allowed management to deny union "salts" the right to sign a union authorization card. "Salts" are union members, paid or unpaid, who seek employment to help their co-workers form a union. The King amendment would have effectively overturned a U.S. Supreme Court decision in which the court ruled 9-0 that workers who take a job with the intention of helping other workers form a union are protected by the National Labor Relations Act. The amendment failed March 1 by 164-264 (R: 162-34; D: 2-230). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #114, March 1, 2007: **OPPOSE (Yes = Wrong, No = Right).**

#### **4. EFCA/Passage—H.R. 800—(03/01/2007, [Roll Call No. 118](#))**

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The bill would restore workers' freedom to form unions free from employer intimidation by allowing employees to sign authorization cards seeking union representation and recognizing the workers' union when a majority sign cards. It would establish a system of mediation and arbitration that would apply to an employer and union that are unable to agree on their first contract. It would require the employer to pay three times the amount of back pay that an employee is due if the employee is illegally fired or discriminated against during an organizational or first-contract drive. The bill passed March 1 by 241-185 (R: 13-183; D: 228-2). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #118, March 1, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

#### **5. Davis –Bacon Requirement —H.R. 720 — (03/09/2007, [Roll Call No. 133](#))**

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The Davis-Bacon Act requires that construction workers on federal projects be paid prevailing wages. It ensures high-quality work standards and decent living standards for workers and their communities. Rep. Richard Baker (R-La.) offered an amendment to the Water Quality Financing Act that would strike language in the bill applying Davis-Bacon requirements to wastewater construction projects financed with nonfederal funds. The amendment failed March 9 by 140-280 (R; 140-50; D; 0-230). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #133, March 9, 2007: **OPPOSE (Yes = Wrong, No = Right)**.

#### **6. Collective Bargaining for Public Safety Officers—H.R. 980— (07/17/2007, [Roll Call No. 633](#))**

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Some 20 states do not fully protect the bargaining rights of firefighters, police officers, corrections officers and emergency medical service workers. Two states—Virginia and North Carolina—prohibit public safety employees from collectively bargaining. H.R. 980 provides collective bargaining rights for public safety officers that work for state or local governments. The bill passed July 17 by 314-97 (D: 216-3; R: 98-94). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #633, July 17, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

#### **7. Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act—H.R. 2831—(07/31/2007, [Roll Call No. 768](#))**

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The bill would overturn a 2007 U.S. Supreme Court ruling that greatly restricted the ability of workers to sue employers for illegal pay discrimination under Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Lilly Ledbetter worked for Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. for more than 20 years but was paid less than men who were doing the same job as she was. It wasn't until many years after she started work that she discovered the pay discrimination and then she filed suit. The court ruled that a worker has only 180 days from the date of the first discriminatory pay check to file suit, even if the worker has no way of knowing for months or even years that the pay disparity is the result of illegal discrimination. H.R. 2831 passed July 31 by 225-199 (R: 2-193; D: 223-6). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #768, July 31, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

#### **8. Popcorn Workers Lung Disease Prevention Act H.R. 2693 Final Passage-(09/26/07, [Roll Call No. 913](#))**

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Diacetyl is chemical flavoring used in microwave popcorn and other foods that is linked to a potentially fatal lung disease. The bill directs the Occupational Safety and Health Administration to issue immediately a regulation protecting workers from exposure to diacetyl. The bill passed Sept. 26 by 260-154 (R: 47-146; D: 213-8). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #913, September 26, 2007: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

## **9. Mine Safety Standards—H.R. 2768— (01/16/2008, [Roll Call No. 10](#))**

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The House passed the Supplemental Mine Improvement and New Emergency Response Act (S-MINER). The bill, along with the 2006 MINER Act, responds to critical safety and health problems in the mining industry, underscored by the 2006 Sago Mine disaster and the overall increase in coal mine fatalities. The legislation requires coal operators to improve their emergency response plans, including installation of rescue chambers in underground coal mines. It also strengthens other protections in current law, including the sealing of abandoned areas in mines, ventilation controls, dust requirements, conveyor belt safety, communication programs and atmospheric monitoring. The bill passed January 16 by a vote of 214-199 (R: 7-183; D: 207-16). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #913, January 16, 2008: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

## **10. Davis-Bacon/Prevailing Wages on Public Housing Projects-H.R. 3524-(01/17/2008, [Roll Call No. 15](#))**

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The Davis-Bacon Act requires that construction workers on federal projects be paid prevailing wages. It ensures high-quality work standards and decent living standards for workers and their communities. Rep. Steve King (R-Iowa) offered an amendment to the HOPE VI Improvement and Reauthorization Act of 2008 to eliminate Davis-Bacon requirements for some public housing construction projects. The amendment failed on January 17 by 136-268 (R: 136-48; D: 0-220). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #15, January 17, 2008: **OPPOSE (Yes = Wrong, No = Right)**.

## **11. Combustible Dust Standard—H.R. 5522—(04/30/2008, [Roll Call No. 233](#))**

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Responding to the tragic explosion Feb. 7 at the Imperial Sugar Refinery in Port Wentworth, Ga., that claimed the lives of 13 workers, the House passed a bill requiring the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) to adopt an emergency standard to regulate combustible industrial dusts that can build up to hazardous levels and cause deadly explosions. Workplace safety experts, including the U.S. Chemical Safety Board in 2006, long have called for a combustible dust standard. But OSHA has failed to act. The bill passed April 30 by a vote of 247-165 (R: 22-165; D: 225-0). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #233, April 30, 2008: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.

## **12. Extension of Unemployment Benefits —H.R. 5749—(06/12/2008, [Roll Call No. 412](#))**

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After the House failed to pass the extended unemployment benefits amendment ([see vote #403](#)), under a procedure requiring a two-thirds supermajority, the House then considered the same bill under regular procedures requiring a simple majority. The bill passed June 12 by a vote of 274-137 (R: 49-137; D: 225-0). The IBEW position on Official Roll Call Vote #412, June 12, 2008: **SUPPORT (Yes = Right, No = Wrong)**.
